

Significant published works covering Sunningdale Golf Club 1910 Bernard Darwin's "The Golf Courses of the British Isles"

contains a sixpage description of the Old Course just after Harry Colt had put in his majorchanges to the 4th, 7th, 8th, 12th, and 13th holes. The Sunningdale chaptercontains a water colour of the view from the 10th tee by Harry Rowntree. Thebook has been reprinted many times and is available cheaply from Amazon. It has a beautiful dust cover of the water colour.

1924. Bernard Darwin wrote a 20 page booklet on the Sunningdale courses entitled "Sunningdale Golf Club". The only copy located is owned by a golf collector in Australia who has allowed the Club a copy. An edited version is available on the Club web.

1957 Guy Bennett, secretary in the years 1933-39 wrote a history of the golf courses. He knew personally several of the original Sunningdale green keepers and he was wonderfully equipped to record accurately the courses story. The book was privately printed, is extremely rare and few golf literature collectors or libraries even know of its existence. It is the most authoritative history of the development of the golf courses of Sunningdale. A copy can be read on the Club web site. 1957-69 Robert Browning, author of many golf books, wrote a course guide for Sunningdale Golf Club, which was regularly reprinted and updated during this period. Copies are occasionally offered for sale on the internet.

1967 “Sheridan of Sunningdale”;

an autobiography by Jimmy Sheridan who retired as Caddie Master at the Club after 50 years service. It is an excellent early history of the club with much detail on the many unusual and accomplished members that the Club has regularly attracted as members. 1991 “Colt and Co: Golf Course Architects. A biography of Harry Colt by Fred Hawtree, himself an eminent golf architect, contains a chapter covering Colt’s period at Sunningdale as the Club’s Secretary. Later he was the Captain of the Club, designed and re-designed the New Course, and made great improvements to the Old Course. The Sunningdale chapter is available on the Club’ web site.

2000 John Whitfield’s official “History of Sunningdale Golf Club” was published, and a few copies are still available from the Club office, price £35

2000 “The Sunningdale Centenary”. This book was financed by advertising, and comprises a collection of twenty essays on various aspects of the history and life of Sunningdale Golf club, including contributions from Peter Thompson, Mark Wilson, Michael Parkinson, Bruce Critchley, Henry Longhurst, Peter Alliss, Renton Laidlaw, and Lewine Mair. 2000 “Sheridan of Denham” by Barbara Hicks, covering the life of Denham professional John Sheridan, who spent all his formative years in association with Sunningdale Golf Club , where his father was the Caddie Master
