

OLD COURSE

LOCAL RULES

1. Out of Bounds (Rule 27)

- (a) Beyond all fences and boundaries (and beyond white posts) adjoining the course.
- (b) On or beyond the path on the left of the 18th green, passing behind the first tee to the gate onto Ridgemount Road. This includes the practice putting green, the area of the flower beds, and that in front of the professional's shop, and car park.

2. Water Hazards and Lateral Water Hazards (Rule 26)

Yellow stakes identify water hazards and red stakes lateral water hazards. Where yellow or red lines exist they define the margin. Elsewhere the margin is where the ground breaks sharply downward.

3. Integral Parts of the Course

- (a) Retaining walls and piling located in water hazards.
- (b) All artificial surfaces of roads and paths **except** the following which are immovable obstructions.
 - i. Railway sleepers and poles on paths to prevent erosion.
 - ii The concrete road crossing the 2nd hole, to the right of the 13th green and beyond the 14th tees. (Rule 24-2 applies).

4. Ground Under Repair (Rule 25-1)

- (a) All areas indicated by G.U.R. notices.
- (b) All areas bounded by white lines.

5. Bunkers

- (a) Stones in Bunkers are movable obstructions. (Rule 24-1 applies).
- (b) All faces of Bunkers, revetted or grassed are neither (a) part of the bunker nor (b) a 'closely mown area' (Rule 25-2).

6. Fixed Sprinkler Heads

All fixed sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief from interference by them may be obtained under Rule 24-2. In addition, if such an obstruction, on or within two club lengths of the putting green of the hole being played, intervenes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may obtain relief, without penalty, as follows:-

If the ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and is within two club lengths of the intervening obstruction, it may be lifted, cleaned and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which (a) is not nearer the hole, (b) avoids such intervention and (c) is not in a hazard or on a putting green.

7. Staked Tree

If a staked tree interferes with a player's stance or swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with Rule 24-2b(i) (Immovable Obstruction). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.
